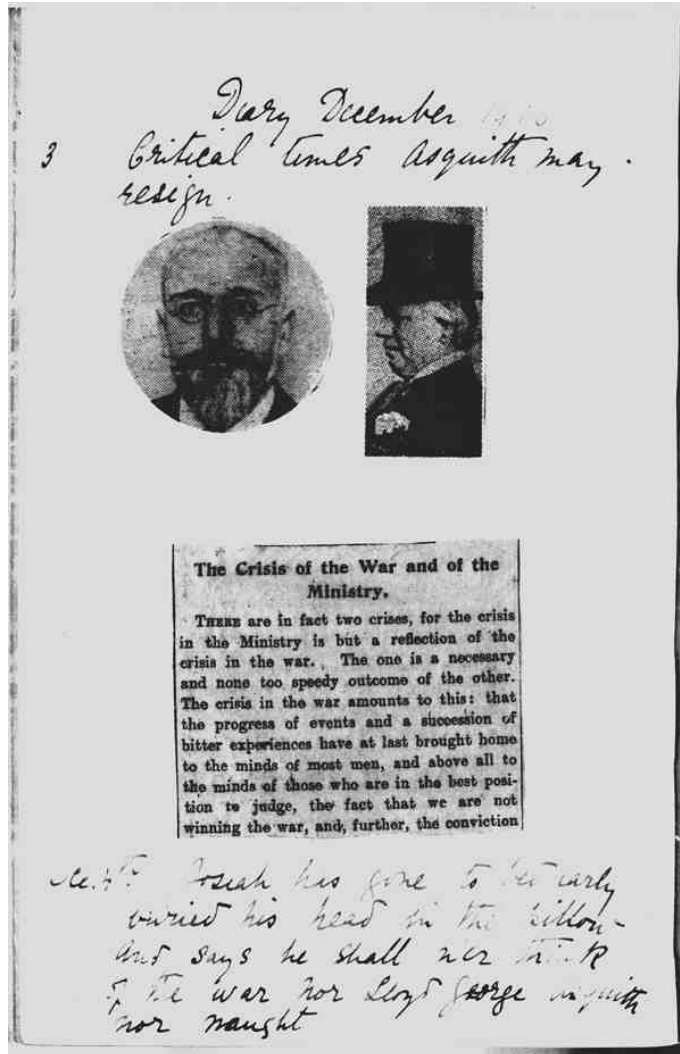


Florence Lockwood – Source 2

Transcript of Dec 4th 1916:

Newspaper: The Crisis of the War and of the Ministry. There are in fact two crises for the crisis in the Ministry is but a reflection of the crisis in the war. The one is a necessary and none to speedy outcome of the other. The crisis in the war amounts to this: that the progress of events and a succession of bitter experiences have at last brought home to the minds of most men, and above all to the minds of those who are in the best position to judge, the fact that we are not winning the war, and further, the conviction...

Dec 4th: Florence Lockwood's diary entry: Josiah has gone to bed early, buried his head in the pillow and says he shall not think of the war nor Lloyd George, Asquith, not nought.
